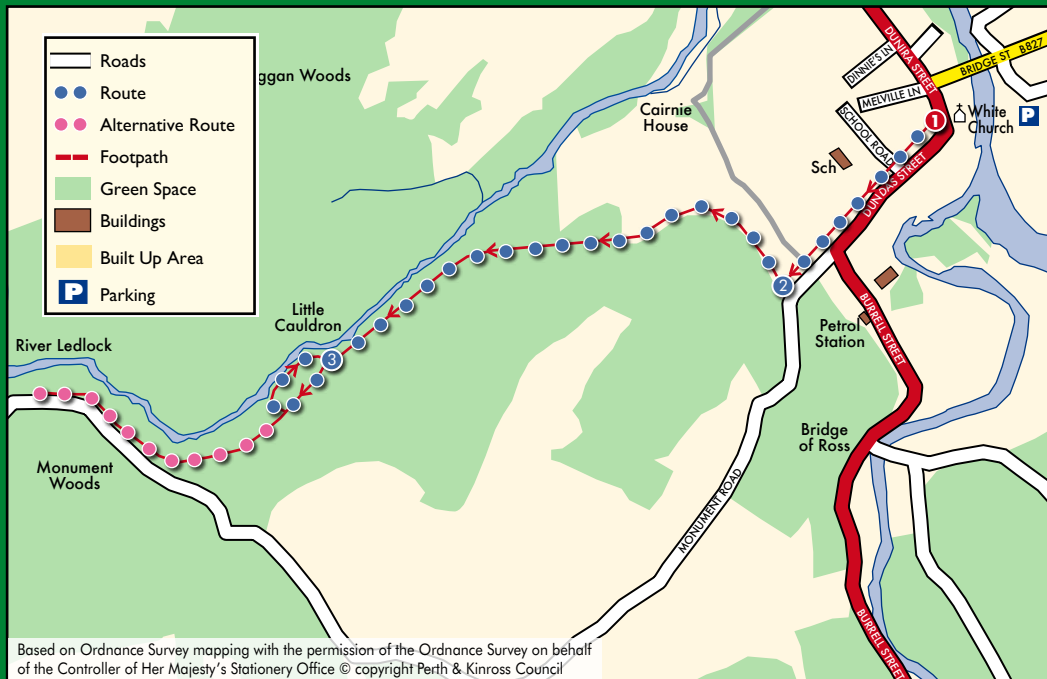


COMRIE The Deil's Cauldron - Little Cauldron Walk



This is also suitable for bikes. 

ROUTE DESCRIPTION:

Distance: 1.7 miles approx

Approx time: 60 minutes

Terrain: Both rough and smooth surfaces

Start: **White Church, Dunira Street**

- 1 Turn left outside the White Church and follow the road round onto Dundas Street. Cross over the road and continue straight onto Monument Road. Just as you're leaving the village (100m approx.) you'll see a sign post on the right hand side to the "Deil's Cauldron"; take it.
- 2 Follow the main path up to the "Little Cauldron" through some beautiful beech woodland. You'll cross a small burn and climb steadily to your destination. Take your time watching out for tree roots, loose gravel/stones—rest against the bank if you need to and take in the view.
- 3 You'll notice getting to the Little Cauldron is down a narrow track which is quite steep on one side. You can do one of three things:
 - Take this track down if you feel confident and follow it back onto the main path for home,
 - Take the main path ahead and turn first right down a track to the Little Cauldron a little further on - less steep.
 - Look at the waterfall from the main path and return back via the same route to the White Church.

●●● Add an additional 1 mile to the Deil's Cauldron.

The Deil's Cauldron (Devil's Kettle) waterfall was created at the end of the last ice age by water, ice and stones grinding out the surrounding rocks. The spot is said to be the preferred haunt of a "brownie" or "water elf" who entices victims down into the gloomy ravine.
